**Subject: SUBMISSION OF SITUATION REPORT CAUSED BY
HEAVY RAINS/FLOODS ON DAILY BASIS**

The Ministry of Home Affairs is the nodal Ministry for monitoring the situation caused by natural calamities except drought, hailstorm & pest attack as well as coordinating emergency response on behalf of Government of India. To facilitate effective monitoring of the situation in the wake of heavy rains/floods etc. particularly during South-West Monsoon, State/UT Governments are required to submit daily situation report on regular basis to the Control Room, Ministry of Home Affairs.

2. During the Annual Conference of Relief Commissioners/Secretaries, Department of Disaster Management held on 22nd April 2009, all the States/UTs were specifically requested to submit daily situation report starting from 1st June and ending 15th October, 2009 so as to facilitate this Ministry to keep a close watch on the rainfall and flood situation throughout the country. The States/UTs were also advised to even send a 'Nil' report if there is nothing to report. It is further mentioned that this Ministry generates a SITREP on daily basis on the situation arising out of heavy rainfall/flood etc., based on the feedback provided by the States/UTs, which is circulated to the Prime Minister Office, Cabinet Secretariat, National Disaster Management Authority, Hon'ble Home Minister and senior officers in MHA and other concerned Ministries.

3. Past experience reveals that a few States/UTs had not submitted their situation reports regularly on daily basis (including 'Nil' reports) despite having been requested repeatedly, which had resulted in considerable delay in consolidation & preparation of a daily situation report.

4. In view of above, Relief Commissioners/ Secretaries of Department of Disaster Management of all States/UTs are requested to ensure sending a report on the situation caused by heavy rains/floods in their States/UTs on daily basis from 1st June 2009 till 15th October, 2009

to the Disaster Management Control Room, (Telephone: 011-23093563 to 66 & Fax:011-23093750) Ministry of Home Affairs in the enclosed prescribed format. This information may be submitted to this Ministry by 1400 hours positively to facilitate us to consolidate the information and generate a daily SITREP for distribution by 1600 hours.
